Bob Caples is a resident in Kugler Woods. He was born in Women's Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland; now Greater Baltimore Memorial Center. There were complications with the birth but God had plans for Bob. Bob's father was Dr. Delphin Delmas Caples, a general practitioner and surgeon. His mother was Louise Skylar Leigh Caples, a registered nurse who served in the army during the North Africa Campaign. Bob's brothers are Dr. Pete Ledley Caples and Richard James Caples. He also has a sister Patricia Lee Bennett Greenwell.

Bob was educated in the schools in Reisterstown, Maryland, attending grade school, junior high and high school there, the same as his father had done. Bob lived in Reisterstown for 44 years. From 1980 to 1999, he worked for the Social Security Administration, eventually retiring from there with a disability.

Bob's hobbies are fascinating. Since the age of six he has collected stamps and coins. Can you imagine the collections he has! He also has a patch collection, arm patches and the like. He enjoys genealogy studies, just as his mother before him. He is a member of the Sons of the Revolution. His great-great-great grandfather fought in the War of 1812 and in the battle for Baltimore in 1814, the battle in which Francis Scott Key wrote the "Star Spangled Banner". He went to Paris as a delegate to the convention of the Sons of the Revolution. He was also in England for a couple of weeks for an event with the Shipley's of Maryland, his father's side of the family.
