~ Chaplain Bill

What a way to start off 2020, a new year. Chaplain Bill has been here 15 years and this lady was here three years before he came. If you know anything about SEM Haven, you know **Mary Banks**. She was born and raised in the coal mining country of Pike County Kentucky, in the town of Canada. Mary's mother was a homemaker and her dad was a coal miner working on the big high tipple emptying coal cars; he retired after 36 years. They had fourteen children, 7 girls and 7 boys.

Mary graduated from high school at nineteen and came to Cincinnati at age twenty in 1949. She worked at Newbury department store as a cashier and then worked at Vest & Barrel Construction Company as a secretary for payroll for 5 years. She later went to work for the Baldwin Piano Company working as a record keeper. It was there she met her first husband, a guard named Homer Cox. They married in 1953 and her daughter Rhonda was born. After a move to Illinois, Homer left them and she and Rhonda moved back to Cincinnati. Mary then went to work at Newtone where she met Frank Banks, a disabled Marine veteran. They married in 1957. Mary went on to become one of the strongest Christian women I've ever met.

Her hobbies are cooking and cleaning. People would often remark that her floor was clean enough to eat off of. She loved cooking so much that she often cooked for her whole church. Mary was a member of the Cozaddale Baptist Church in Goshen, Ohio where our own Bill Webb (volunteer minister) baptized her. Mary later went to the Woodville Baptist Church and then to the First Baptist Church of Milford. She never misses church and even goes to revival meetings. Mary goes to chapel here at SEM Haven each Sunday as viel. She volunteers as a chapel helper and helps make rosaries with our Catholic volunteer group.

She loves the old TV sit-coms and her favorite movie star is John Wayne. She loves semi-classical and Christian music, especially Southern Gospel quartets.

Mary could be described by many great passages but I love Psalm 26. I hold this one for me and I think you can see Mary in it. Here are some excerpts from Psalm 26:1-3 Judge me, Oh Lord, for I have walked in mine integrity; I have trusted also in the Lord; therefore, I shall not slide. Examine me, Oh Lord and the week try my reins and my heart. For thy loving kindness is before mine eyes and I have walked in the truth. Verse 8, Lord I loved the habitation to thy house and the place where thine honor dwelleth. Verse 12, My foot standeth in an even place; in the congregations will I bless the Lord.
