ELDER SPOTLIGHT

Our elder this month is a most special one. She and her wonderful family came to us in Sept. 2019. Her family loved to volunteer to help us in any way possible. Unfortunately, Nancy Drysdale was called home in early October. Her family allowed us to do an article on Nancy posthumously, because of her and family's ties with SEM Haven. Nancy Lou Kincaid was born in 1928 at Bethesda Oak Hospital. Her farther Earle worked as an engineer, and her mother Olive worked at the hospital. She was an only child. During the depression the family lived with her grandparents in Mt. Carmel, where her father became the Clermont County Auditor. She went to Mt. Carmel School where her mom worked in the cafeteria. She later graduated in 1946 from Batavia High School. At a high school reunion, Nancy met George Drysdale, who had just returned from the navy. They both attended UC where Nancy majored in Home Economics and George in Electrical Engineering. Nancy graduated in 1951 and began a career at CG&E where she worked as "Ann Holiday". CG&E used Home Economists to teach homeowners how to use "more" electricity! Nancy and George were married at the Summerside Methodist Church. Nancy continued to work for CG&E as "Ann Holiday" until a pregnancy ended her career. Those were different times then. They lived in Withamsville then Mt. Carmel. They had four children, two grandchildren and two great grandchildren. They continued to be members of the Summerside United Methodist Church where Nancy taught Sunday school, sang in the choir, served in women's groups and became church historian. Their church was one of the 26 that started the SEM Communities. George was a board member for SEM Villa. Nancy's mom was a resident of SEM Haven when it first opened. In the 60's and 70's Nancy would make appearances on shows with Paul Dixon and Bob Braun and Betty Rogge in Dayton, where she would demonstrate new products. In 1963, George established Caolo Drysdale & Associates, a manufacturer's representative company. What a couple! What a family! We just scratched the surface of their lives. A passage I like for the Drysdale's is 1 Peter 1:15 "But as He who called you is holy; you also be holy in all your conduct. (NKJV). The short time we had Nancy and ner family with us, will bless us forever.
